



THE FILM IN 38 WORDS

CONCEPTS OF CHILDHOOD

The film represents children as bearers of hope for peaceful coexistence. This motif traces back to Enlightenment imaginings of childhood.

The short film portrayes childlike, naive protagonists in a comical-ironic manner, allowing for an approach to the often controversially discussed topic of Christian-Muslim encounter.
