# **GUIDANCE FOR THE MASTER'S THESIS**

# European and International Economic Law (LL.M.)

#### 1. General information

The Master's thesis aims to demonstrate that students are capable of independently addressing a research question within their field of study by applying appropriate scientific methods and completing the work within a defined time frame.

The **final module** carries a total of **21 ECTS credits**, comprising **18 ECTS credits** for the **written Master's thesis** and **3 ECTS credits** for the **presentation**.

#### 2. Timeline and Deadlines

Students are requested to submit their **preferences for supervision** by the **end of December**. Supervisors will be assigned at the **beginning of January** (calendar week 1). The **allocation of thesis topics** will take place during the **first week of February** (calendar week 5).

The processing period for the Master's thesis is 16 weeks. An extension of the submission deadline is only possible upon presentation of a valid medical certificate.

The submission deadline for the thesis is set for the end of May (calendar week 20).

The evaluation and correction process will be completed by the beginning of September (calendar week 36), and the final results will be recorded and released by the end of September (calendar week 39).

### 3. Formal Requirements and Submission Regulations

The Master's thesis must comprise a minimum of 80,000 and a maximum of 120,000 characters (including spaces and footnotes). The cover page, table of contents, bibliography and any list of sources and abbreviations are not included in the character count.

The following guidelines apply to text formatting:

• Font size: 12 points

Character spacing: normal

• Line spacing: 1,5 lines

Page margins: left margin of 7 cm

The thesis must include a complete **bibliography** including the sources cited in the footnotes.

A declaration of independence must be attached, confirming that the thesis was prepared independently and that only the sources and resources indicated have been used. Both electronic and printed versions of the thesis must be submitted. Two printed copies must be handed in to the Examinations Office. The electronic submission via the Moodle learning platform is decisive for meeting the submission deadline. Submission by e-mail is not permitted.

## 4. The use of artificial intelligence (AI)

The use of artificial intelligence (AI) tools is permitted only in accordance with the university's academic integrity guidelines and must be appropriately disclosed if applied. Responsibility for the content and form of the work remains with the author. If AI tools are used, the declaration of independence must include a transparency clause stating which AI tool was used. Please specify exactly which tool(s) were used.

Examples of wording:

- "The AI tool XXX (e.g., ChatGPT 4o) was used in writing this Master's thesis."
- "The AI translation tool XXX (e.g., DeepL Translator) was used in writing this Master's thesis."
