Survey Research Methods

Course Description

This course provides an introduction to the design and implementation of surveys as a research method. Students will learn how to collect primary data via surveys. This includes topics such as the search for suitable scales in the literature, own scale development, test theory and test quality criteria, questionnaire design and programming, sampling methods, sample acquisition, data protection, ethical issues, open science, and analysis options. Moreover, the course will cover the use of existing secondary survey data. As part of the course, students will develop their own questionnaire on a topic of their choice. We will also explore whether secondary data are available and how they can be used for students' selected research topics.

Assignment/Grades

Students are expected to actively participate in class, including leading a short discussion (10-15 minutes) of a selected methodological paper. Following their research interests, students will develop a comprehensive questionnaire on a topic of their choice, also comprising a pre-registration (following the questions on https://aspredicted.org/). Students are also expected to give a short presentation (10-15 minutes) on an existing survey or panel that academics can use for their own research. The questionnaire & pre-registration will account for 60% of the grade. The presentation of a secondary data source and participation in class will each account for 20% of the grade.
