Your position

You will contribute to a new research field at the Accounting Cluster, which addresses topics related to Sustainability Reporting. In particular, we intend to examine corporate sustainability reporting practices and management controls for sustainability. As part of the network, you will be building your research portfolio and working towards high-impact publications. When applying for the post-doctoral position, you can pursue the German postdoctoral degree "Habilitation" from LMU. The position is limited to three years with a possible extension of a further three years. The position is non tenure track. If all the requirements of civil service law are met, you can be appointed as a temporary civil servant, otherwise on a TV-L E13 pay grade appointment. There is the possibility of part-time employment.

To analyze our research questions, we apply analytical approaches relying on agency theory as well as empirical approaches, including archival work, field studies, and surveys.
