1.1 Lectures & Tutorials

- Exchange students can choose **all regular courses (lecture + tutorial)** offered in the bachelor and the master program (Master of Science in Economics), however NOT courses from the Master of Science in Quantitative Economics.

Language

- Bachelor level: Some courses are taught in English. German courses require a B2 level.
Master level: Entire program is taught in English

Recommendations for Course Selection

- Economics courses at LMU are quite technical and include formal proofs → sound knowledge of math is required!
- Master courses are only recommended to advanced and highly motivated undergraduate students, who are willing to put in the required extra effort!
- Recommendation:
 - Go to various classes in the first two weeks of the semester and then decide which classes you like!
 - Do not overstrain yourself!


