1.1 Lectures & Tutorials

- Exchange students can choose **all regular courses (lecture + tutorial)** offered in the bachelor and the master program (Master of Science in Economics), however NOT courses from the Master of Science in Quantitative Economics.

Language

- Bachelor level: Some courses are taught in English. German courses require a B2 level.
Master level: Entire program is taught in English

Further Exam Information to Note

- **No retake exams and no alternative exam forms** can be offered:
 - Taking courses from different faculties can result in exams that overlap. You are therefore responsible for checking your individual exam dates at the beginning of semester and making necessary changes to your course schedule.
 - students matriculated at LMU for the consecutive semester: check LSF to see if a review tutorial and a re-test are offered in the next semester
- **Specific Learning Disability (SLD):**
 - Students who have a documented SLD and wish to make use of compensation for disadvantages, must **apply** to the **ISC (Econ Exam Office) by the end of the exam registration period at the latest**. Late applications cannot otherwise be taken into account

To ensure that all your examination results are enclosed please adhere to the following procedure:

- 1) Add all courses you take to your schedule in LSF (→ in LSF course catalog select course and press "add to schedule"). If you later drop courses, then please remove from schedule otherwise they will still show up in transcript at semester end
- 2) If you have taken any courses from departments other than Economics or Management, please ask the respective lecturer to upload your examination results directly in LSF.

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Certificates of Arrival/Departure

- Many exchange students (e.g., Erasmus+/SEMP/UK) need a Certificate of Arrival signed upon arrival in Munich and Certificate of Departure at the end of their stay for their home university. This is particularly mandatory for Erasmus+ students, as the Erasmus grant is calculated based on the arrival and departure dates

Procedure:

- 1) Your university issues you the certificate
- 2) You send the certificate to the [LMU International Office Incoming Team](#) who is responsible for signing it. (not the Economics Incoming-Exchange Office)
