Grade conversion for international applicants for the Master's degree program in Pharmaceutical Sciences

According to § 4, paragraph 2 of the Eignungsfeststellungsordnung (aptitude assessment regulations) [1], the following applies:

³Applicants who have completed or will soon complete a university degree in a subject related to pharmacy within Germany or who have a foreign university degree within the definition of § 3 para. 1 sentence 1 of the Prüfungs- und Studienordnung (Examination and Study Regulations) of the Ludwig-Maximilians-Universität München for the Master's degree program in Pharmaceutical Sciences in the currently valid version, will be admitted to the second stage of the aptitude assessment procedure if the average grade in the certificate or in the "Transcript of Records" is 2.5 or better. Otherwise, participation in the second stage of the aptitude assessment procedure is excluded.

The modified Bavarian formula is used to convert foreign grades into the German grading system:

$$x = 1 + 3 \frac{N_{max} - N_d}{N_{max} - N_{min}}$$

x = Searched grade

N_{max} = best achievable grade in the foreign grading system

N_{min} = worst achievable grade in the foreign grading system

N_d = grade to be converted into the German grading system.

Grades are rounded to one decimal place.
