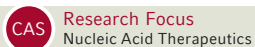
Workshop of the CAS Research Focus “Dis/Similarities” organized by Prof. Dr. Francesca Biagini (LMU).

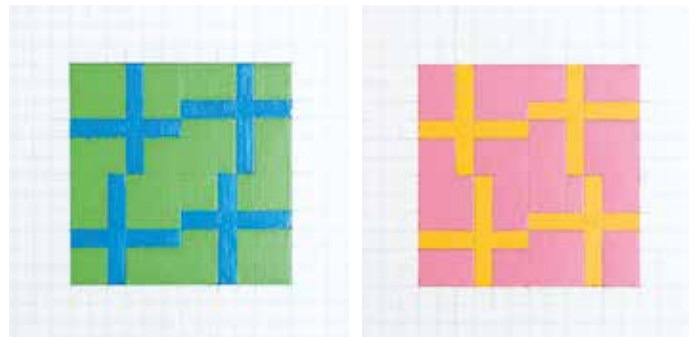

Karol Bethke (1940–2017) war ein deutscher Maler, Zeichner und Bildhauer. Er gilt als Vertreter der Konkreten Kunst, die vor einhundert Jahren ihre programmatische Begründung fand. Nach seinem Studium der Malerei an der HdK bei Hermann Bachmann folgten zahlreiche Ausstellungen im In- und Ausland. 1980 erhielt er das begehrte MoMA PS 1 Stipendium. Nach mehreren Jahren in New York kehrte Bethke 1984 nach Berlin zurück, wo er bis zu seinem Tod lebte. Die Ausstellung am CAS konzentriert sich auf Bethkes Papierarbeiten, in denen er mit farbkraftigen Lackfarben und feinen Linien das Verhältnis zwischen Malerei und Zeichnung auslotet.

Marie-Luise Heske ist Kuratorin und Referentin der Stiftung für Konkrete Kunst und Design Ingolstadt. Die Stiftung ist die maßgebende Initiative zur Förderung der Konkreten Kunst in Deutschland und am Museum für Konkrete Kunst (MKK) beheimatet. Zuletzt kuratierte sie die vielbeachtete Ausstellung „Martin Creed. I don’t know what art is“. **Mario Günther** ist akademischer Rat am Zentrum für Mathematische Philosophie der LMU. Für seine Theorie des Lernens von konditionalen Informationen erhielt er den Wolfgang-Stegmüller-Preis. Im Wintersemester 23/24 war Mario Günther Junior Researcher in Residence am CAS.

Der Nachlass Karol Bethke wird von Bernheimer Contemporary vertreten.

Sebastian Schneeweiss is Professor of Medicine and Epidemiology at Harvard Medical School and Chief of the Division of Pharmacoepidemiology and Pharmacoeconomics of the Department of Medicine, Brigham and Women's Hospital. He has developed analytic methods to improve the scientific validity of epidemiologic analyses using complex longitudinal healthcare databases. **Michal Abrahamowicz** is Professor at the Division of Clinical Epidemiology of the McGill University Health Centre. His area of expertise is methodological research on the development of new statistical methodology and collaborative research, in which these new methods are applied in epidemiologic and clinical studies. Both are currently Visiting Fellows in the context of the CAS Research Focus "Medical Data Processing".

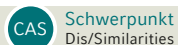

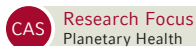

Michael Kimmage is Professor of History at the Catholic University of America in Washington and a Non-resident Senior Associate at the Center for Strategic and International Studies. From 2014 to 2016, he served on the Secretary's Policy Planning Staff at the U.S. Department of State, where he handled the Ukraine/Russia portfolio. His book *Collisions* (Oxford University Press, 2024) provides an account of the war's global dimensions. He was Visiting Fellow at CAS in different contexts. **Yvonne Kleinmann** is Professor of Eastern European History at the University of Halle and currently Visiting Fellow at the Historische Kolleg and at the Käte Hamburger Kolleg *global dis:connect*. **Martin Schulze Wessel** is Professor of East and South Eastern European History at LMU. Last year he published *Der Fluch des Imperiums. Die Ukraine, Polen und der Irrweg in der russischen Geschichte* (Beck, 2023).

The Evolution of Incompatibilities

Workshop in the context of the CAS Research Focus "Speciation".

Even Darwin could not find a satisfactory solution to the obvious paradox of why natural selection tolerates the development of highly disadvantageous traits, such as sterility and infertility. This "mystery of mysteries" is one of the most important and unanswered questions of biological research in the last 150 years. A new research approach suggests that certain molecular structures are probably responsible for the emergence of incompatibility between species and for the sterility or infertility of hybrids.
